The Offices of Graduate Medical Education and Faculty Affairs embraced efforts to return to pre-Covid functioning albeit with recognition that virtual formats are likely to continue into the future. Meetings and educational activities have conditioned faculty and learners to time saving and other benefits which at best be combined in hybrid formats going forward especially given the decentralized system in which BSOM is organized.

BSOM was given full accreditation as a sponsor of GME programs by the ACGME with no citations or areas of improvement for the 15th consecutive year. No programs are on probation and the number of program citations and has continued to be relatively low across programs. Interviews will remain in a virtual format for the upcoming recruiting season as will the majority of other programs across the U.S.

Two new programs in Family Medicine – Rural Family Medicine Residency and Addiction Medicine Fellowship are in the final stages of review by the ACGME for a potential launch in 2023. This Rural Family Medicine is a 1+2 program where the residents will spend the first year with the BSOM-sponsored WSU Family Medicine program and the last two years at Family Health Services of Darke County and Wayne Hospital is located in Greenville, OH, about an hour northeast of Dayton. The Addiction Medicine Fellowship is working in conjunction with Miami Valley Hospital and OneFifteen. While core programs have remained relatively stable, fellowships have been actively developing in several areas including Pediatric Emergency Medicine, Pediatric Hospital Medicine, and Addiction Medicine. In addition, others in Headache, Neurology Critical Care, Pulmonary Critical Care are in discussion.

Dayton Area Graduate Medical Education Consortium (DAGMEC) Research Forum was hosted virtually with 86 resident and fellow physicians presented posters judged by 48 BSOM faculty. This year's event was a success due to the strong leadership of Lisa Kellar. MD and Heidi Sowl.

Faculty Affairs was successful in promoting sixteen (16) fully affiliated members which is an all-time record for advancement with the support of Ty Lea Gebhard. Faculty Affairs supported a change in the format of the BSOM Annual Faculty Meeting to an expanded in person meeting which was coupled with Faculty Awards presentation at White Hall that attracted approximately 50 participants.

Continuing Medical Education experienced an increase in the number of activities due to the adjustment of in-person events with a decrease in overall Covid-19 cases. BSOM offered 1,859 AMA-PRA CME events in 65 series training providing 14,798 credit hours, 6,826 credit hours to physicians and 7,972 hours to non-physicians (APN, PA, resident physicians, fellow physicians, and medical students).

Dr. Albert Painter has announced his retirement at the end of 2022 after 15 years as Associate Dean for GME and Faculty Affairs. Searches are underway for his replacements.

Undergraduate medical education [medical school]

Created patient safety quality improvement curriculum and subsequent two -week elective for BSOM students. Inaugural session was in May 2022. This course will be offered ongoing.

Created initial baseline curriculum for physicians in healthcare leadership elective available to BSOM MS4 students. *Currently expanding and revising in partnership with Dr. David Dhanraj* This elective will be offered ongoing.

BSOM Advanced doctoring bootcamp – Step 2 four -hour prep for all students taking ST2 in the areas of quality, safety and ethics.

BSOM Faculty Leadership Academy (Course Director). Nine half day monthly sessions for fully affiliated and selected key staff members nominated by department chairs to develop skills leading to future advancement. Past graduates have become chairs, associate deans and university vice presidents. Course topics presented include Emotional Intelligence, Leadership Characteristics, and Resilience.

Chaired Premier Health system-level palliative care education committee to create physician learning content focused on understanding the difference between hospice and palliative care and the importance of having timely discussions / offering choices to patients and families. Six videos were filmed using physician champions. All resident programs received the video links. 1.5 CME is available for our faculty upon completion of viewing.
